


Motivation and Success

Why are we proposing a change?

- Nationally, there is a move to reimagine the curriculum in S1 to S3 to increase pace and align it better with the Senior Phase.
- Attendance in S3 is lower than in other years. We have identified a need for S3 to be less fragmented, more focused and purposeful with clear end goals.
- Many pupils are already achieving 4th CfE level in S3 and need further stretch and challenge – they are ready to begin N5s
- Learning in S4 is rushed with little time for enrichment or achievement beyond SQA courses.
- The curriculum in S4/5/6 has narrowed as an unintentional consequence of the 6-6-6 model. Pupils going on to study 4 or 5 Highers have fewer subjects to choose from.
- In S6, pupils often have to pick up learning they have not done at N5 level which makes it harder to achieve the Higher.

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Desired Outcomes

- S3 will have more purpose and rigour and pupils will attain more highly. This
 will be achieved by focusing learning on key subjects that they intend to
 continue study.
- Enrichment electives will provide engaging learning that will add enjoyment and personalisation at a stage when some young people become disengaged from school. It is an opportunity to develop skills, interests and achieve in a different way.
- There will be more flexibility across S3 and S4 for learning such as our Skills Academy, work experience and personal achievement opportunities not just SQA qualifications.
- Pupils will know their strongest subjects as a result of our new Working Grades in S1 to S3 which will make option choices easier.
- Our Careers Adviser will work with S2 instead of S3 in group and 1:1 settings so that all pupils make informed decisions.
- There will be greater options to enhance qualifications and experiences for pupils staying on to S6

What are pupils saying?

- Pupils in S5 were positive about doing 7 courses over 2 years. They felt it would give them more choice for further study and they would not have to crash as many Highers in S6.
- Pupils in S4 were more concerned about the workload involved in 7 courses but felt if they could start them in S3 to spread the learning it would be manageable.
- Almost all S4 pupils kept the same courses from S2 to S4. A
 few picked up a subject not studied in S3. They liked the
 option to do this, if necessary, but had to catch up on
 learning missed in S3.
- Pupils in S3 consulted were all intending to select from the 9 they had studied in S3. They were positive about the option to have more breadth in S4.

What are parents/carers saying?

Our recent survey had 56 responses.

Almost all were in agreement about widening to 7 courses. The most common reasons were:

- More time to prepare for SQA courses
- More choice for Highers in S5 and S6
- Better engagement in learning in S3 because pupils see the purpose of learning

Other comments were about the enrichment options which would bring enjoyment and engagement

Comments/Concerns

S2 is too early to pick subjects as most don't know what they want to do yet

Pupils may not like a course and want to change it

If choosing in S2, parents need to be involved in option interviews and pathways planning

Studying fewer subjects in S3 may limit choices in the longer term for Highers
